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Activity Name: Rhyming and Matching

- Instructions
 - 1. Cut out each rhyming card
 - 2. Mix them up!
 - 3. Match up the rhyming cards
- Extension Activity Ideas
 - Ask the child to find other words that rhyme. Having a rhyming scavenger hunt in their bedroom or another room in the house is a great way to encourage practicing rhyming.
 - o Lay the rhyming cards face down in front of you. Play a game of rhyming memory, taking turns flipping cards one by one until you can find a match.
