- Instructions
 - 1. Identify an instance where child does something that may make another person feel upset.
 - 2. Relate the way the child acted to the read-aloud "How Do Dinosaurs Say I Love You"
 - 3. For example, if the child threw sand at another child, ask how the dinosaur in the story apologized.
 - 4. Ask them what they think the dinosaur in the story would have done to make things better.
 - a. Offer a suggestion if they're having trouble
 - 5. Make a game out of acting out the apology as the dinosaur. This normalizes the process of apologizing, and makes it seem like a fun activity instead of a chore.
