

Book title: *If You Give a Pig a Party*

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Supplies for activities needed:

- Pig printable
- Scissors
- Coloring utensils: colored pencils, markers, crayons, etc
- Hiding places (inside a house or outside)
- An adult or friend to hide the pigs

Activity Name: **Hide and seek activity with Pig**

- School Readiness Outcomes (SRO) goals met:
 - This activity will help a child experiment with the writing utensils and materials (pg 9).
 - The child will be able to indicate which coloring utensils they will like to use for coloring their pig and who to help hide their pigs for the activity (pg 10).
 - Through this activity, the child will be using their problem-solving skills to look in various places for their pig. If they cannot find it in one spot, an alternative method will be used to find their pig (pg 11).
- Instructions
 1. First, print out the pig printable (more than one can be printed, about 4-5) to have the child color and cut out. The child can use whatever coloring utensils they desire. After the pigs are colored, have the child use scissors to cut the pigs out.
 2. After the pigs are colored and cut, an adult can hide the colored pigs in various places inside or outside their home. This will be very similar to a normal hide-and-seek game, but instead, the child is seeking for their pig cutouts instead of a person!

3. After the pigs have been hidden, have the child search for their colored pigs and then brought all together in one pile. This game can be played many times! Have fun and enjoy!
- Extension Activity Ideas
 - Time the child to see how long it will take them to find all of their colored pigs.
 - Have the child hide with their pigs and have an adult or friend find the child hiding with the pigs!
 - Compare the color of the pigs, if they were all colored differently in the beginning.
