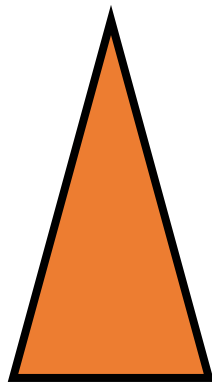
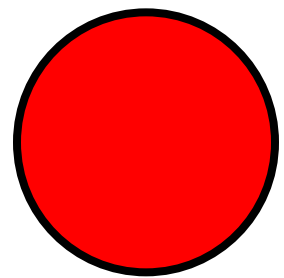
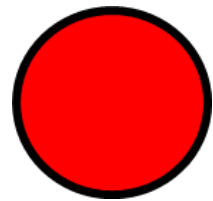
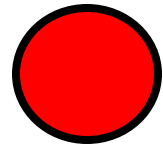
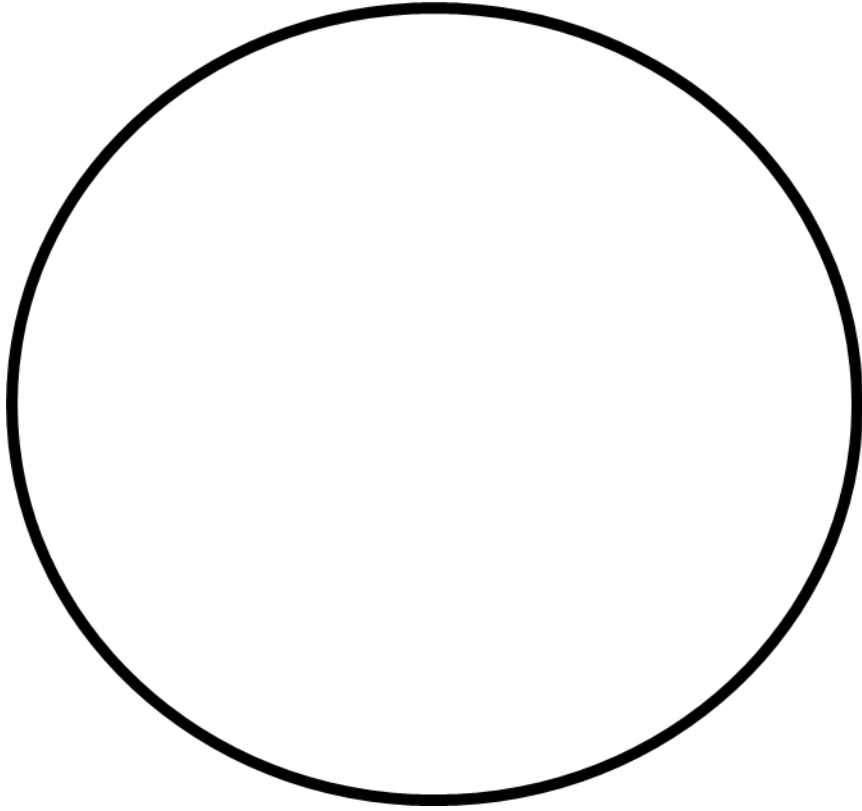
Activity Name: Build Your Own Snowman

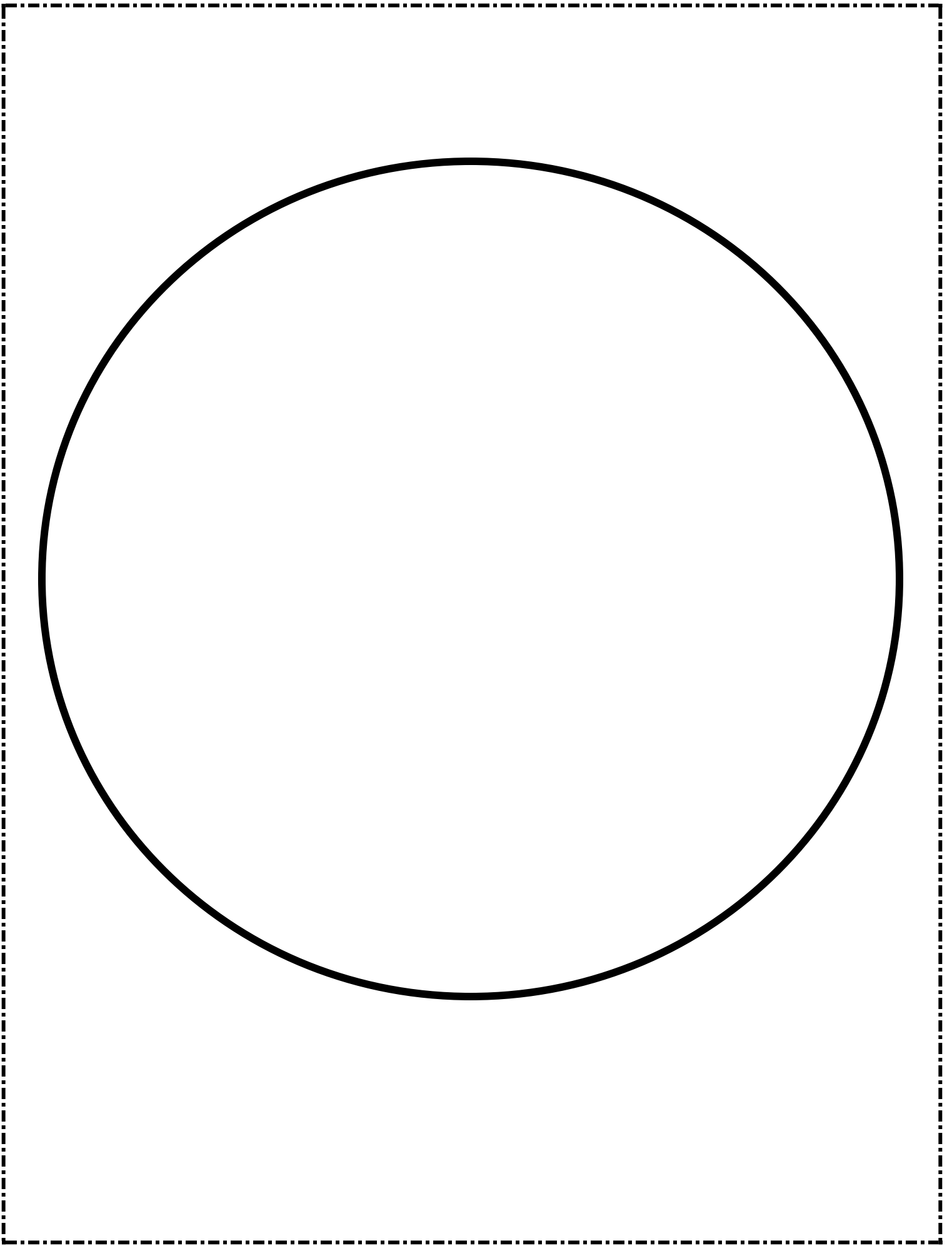
- School Readiness Outcomes (SRO) goals met:
  - The child lines up three or more objects
  - The child groups similar items together
  - Creates a graduated series
- Instructions
  1. Print the snowman printable attached to this document
  2. Use the scissors, or ask an adult for help, to cut the shapes on the printable
  3. Sort shapes into groups
    - a. Group 1: white snowballs
    - b. Groups 2: black coal eyes
    - c. Group 3: orange carrot nose
    - d. Group 4: red buttons
  4. Start with Group 1. From top-to-bottom, order the snowballs from smallest to biggest.
  5. Add glue to the bottom-half of the small snowball and attach to the front-half of the medium snowball.
  6. Add glue the bottom half of the medium snowball and attach to the large snowball.
  7. Next, using Group 2, put glue on the back of both coals and attach to the top of the small snowball. Align the coals side-by-side so the coals look like the snowman's eyes.

8. Using Group 3, put glue on the back of the carrot and attach it to the center of the small snowball, right bellow the coal eyes. The carrot will act as the snowman's nose.
  9. Now, order the buttons top-to-bottom from Group 4 from smallest to biggest.
  10. Start with the smallest button. Put glue on the back and attach to the top of the medium snowball.
  11. Next, put glue on the back of the medium button and attach the medium button bellow the small button.
  12. Then, put glue on the back of the large button and attach bellow the medium button.
  13. Lastly, let your snowman dry.
- Extension Activity Ideas
    - Have children draw what they think the snowman's book is about
