

Book title: *Dog on a Frog?*

Questions asked during Reading:

- Have you ever sat on top of a frog? I know I sure haven't! (pgs 2-3)
- On page 4, we noticed that there were some rhyming words: dog, log, and frog. Can you name 2 more words that rhyme with those words?
 - Some examples are: fog, hog, and jog!
- On page 8, we see that the bears are sitting on stairs. How many bears do you see on this page?
 - Together, we counted 6 bears sitting on stairs.
- On page 9, we read some more rhyming words: slug and plug. Can you help me think of 3 more words that rhyme with slug and plug?
 - Some examples are: jug, rug, tug, dug, and hug!
- On pages 15 and 16, we noticed a whale sitting on nails. Nails are very sharp! Make sure to not step or sit on any nails like this whale did!
- Can we think of any more words that rhyme with mice and rice? (pg 18)
 - Some examples are: dice, lice, and nice
- On page 20, we notice that a poodle is sitting on noodles. Have you ever seen a poodle on noodles? That's silly! We are supposed to eat noodles, not sit on them!
- What do you think the frog is going to sit on? (pg 22)
- On page 24, what is the frog sitting on? That's right, a chair! Does the word "frog" rhyme with the word "chair"? Nope, but "air," "tear," and "fair" do!

- School Readiness Outcomes (SRO) goals met:
 - Producing a rhyme when words are offered (pg 6). This story shares A LOT of rhymes. We spoke about a couple of rhymes, but the story shares a lot more that we did not cover in the reading.
